MMC's newest initiative [4Mi Interactive](#) will allow you to explore 4Mi data via interactive visuals – it means we can share what refugees and migrants are saying more directly, and you can find exactly the information you are looking for.

4Mi Interactive, kicks off with 9 months of data on refugee and migrants' experience of the Covid-19 crisis.

MMC's 4Mi monitors have been able to stay in touch with refugees and migrants throughout the Covid-19 crisis. Since April 2020, we have conducted around 20,000 interviews by phone, to find out exactly how the crisis has affected refugees' and migrants' lives and journeys without putting anyone at risk.

4Mi Interactive provides a new way of accessing the data: Are you interested in how income loss has affected respondents in a particular region? Or what the impacts of Covid-19 have been on particular nationalities, on the use of smugglers, on people's migration journeys and the risks they experienced. Were needs different earlier in the crisis than later? Or what are the differences in access to information or health services between gender and age group?

4Mi Interactive allows you to explore all these questions and more.

Soon we will also launch 4Mi Interactive for our 'traditional' survey. Updated quarterly, this will cover the full range of themes: profiles, drivers, intentions, protection issues, financing, smuggling, access to information and information, and needs for assistance.

The virtual event will include an introduction to 4Mi, a presentation on the adaptation of 4Mi data collection to the pandemic and a demonstration and tips & tricks on how to use the dashboard.

MMC began collecting data directly from refugees and migrants on the move in 2014 – placing those on the move and what they say at the heart of our understanding of the mixed migration phenomenon. Our network of 4Mi monitors now extends from Asia to Latin America and operates (as of early 2021) in 17 countries. Monitors, who are often refugees or migrants themselves, each conduct more than a dozen interviews every month, spending around half an hour each time, asking respondents about their journey. MMC has responded to the Covid-19 crisis by changing the data it collects and the way it collects it. In March 2020, MMC revised its methodology, to be able to recruit and interview participants by phone instead of face-to-face. It developed a new survey, continuing to collect information on individual profiles and routes, but also capturing information on Covid-19 – awareness of the disease and access to health services, as well as the broader impact of the crisis, including on mixed migration.
