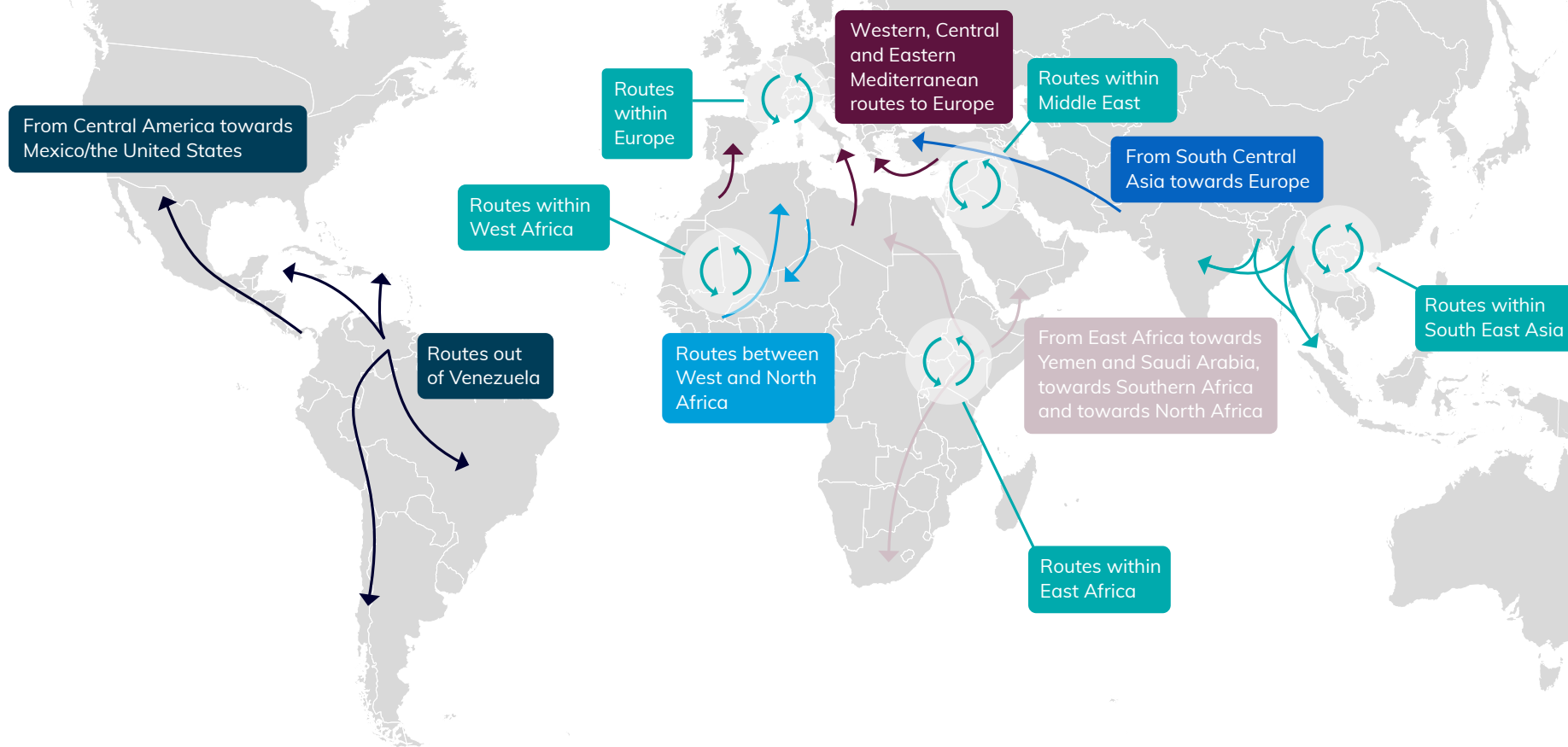

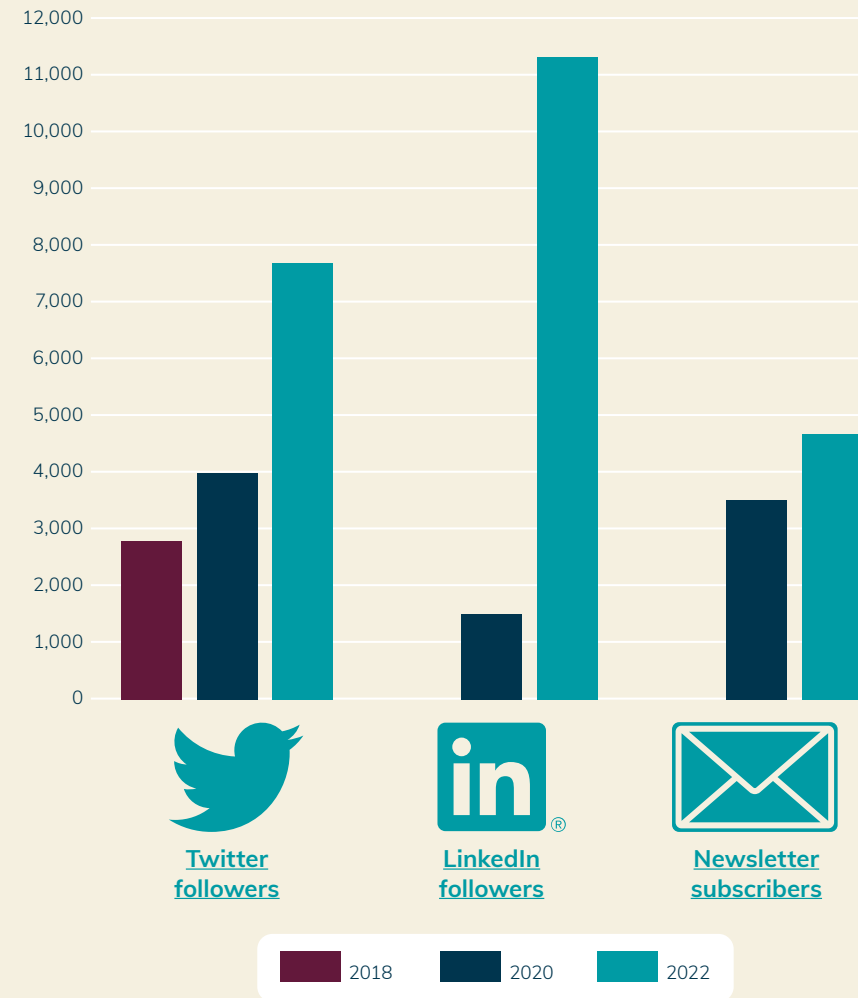

2018



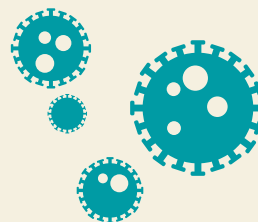
Publication of the first annual [Mixed Migration Review \(MMR\)](#). The MMR has become the annual landmark report on mixed migration.

Rapid adaptation of [4Mi data collection](#) at the onset of the COVID-19 crisis, shifting to remote interviews and interviewing 23,000 refugees & migrants on the impact of the pandemic.

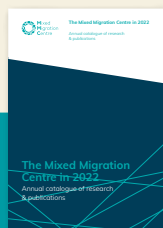


Launch of [4Mi Interactive](#), making our data publicly available for users to create their own graphs and apply filters

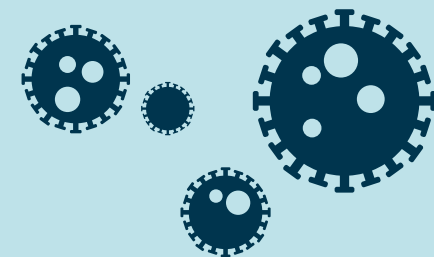

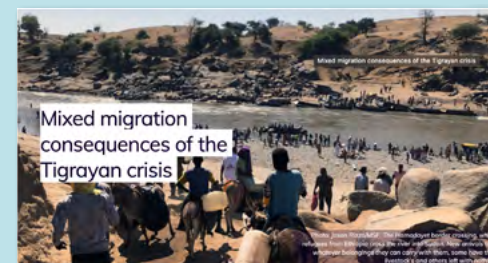
