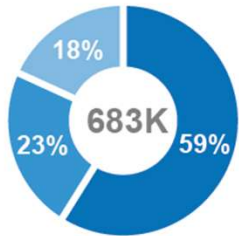

Percentage growth in Sudanese refugee numbers versus all nationalities since the start of the crisis



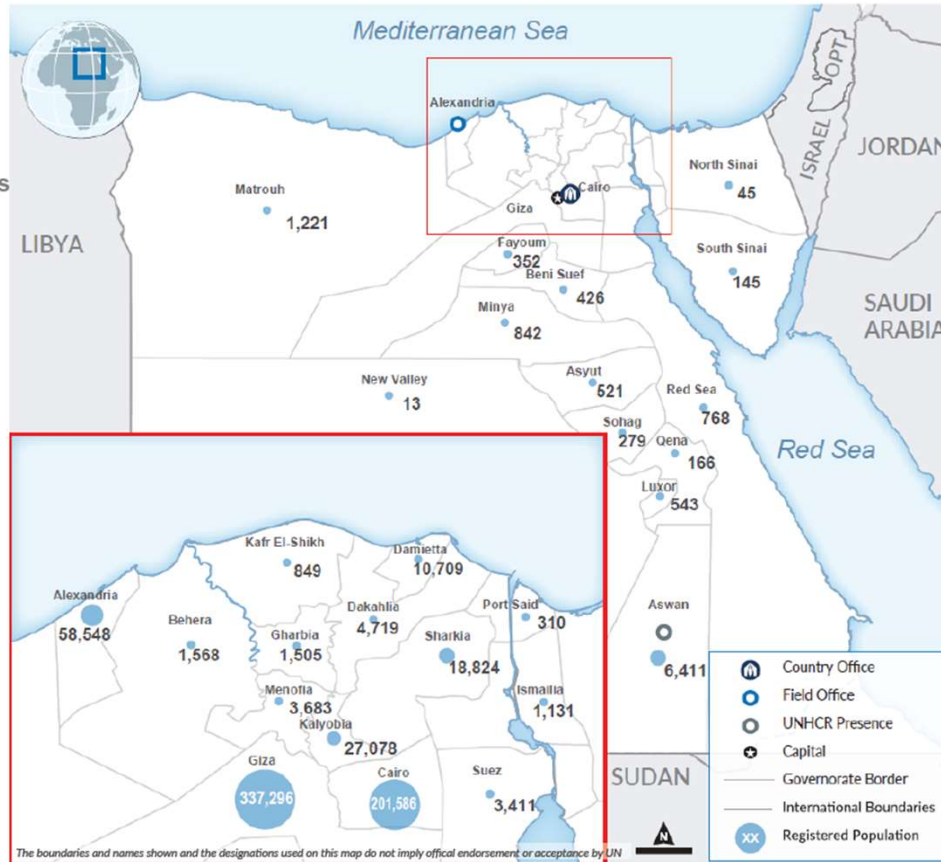
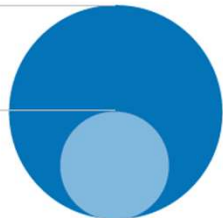

 By Dec 2024, the estimated refugees and Asylum Seekers registered with UNHCR will reach **0.9M**

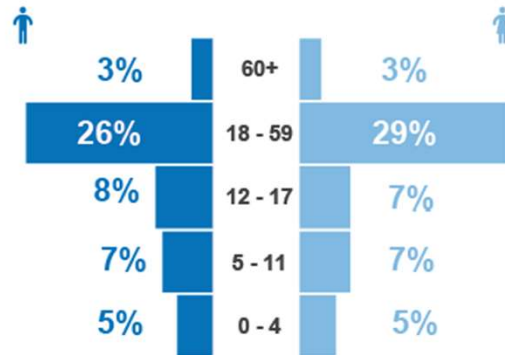
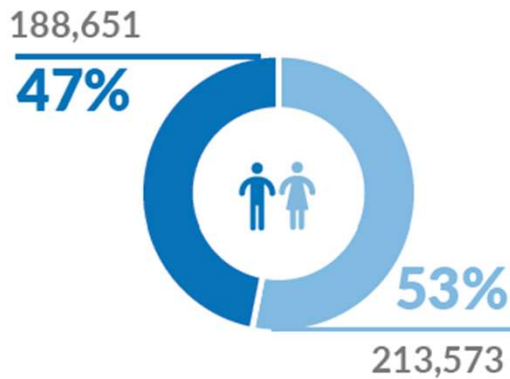

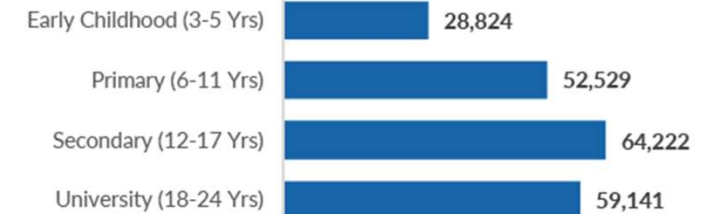

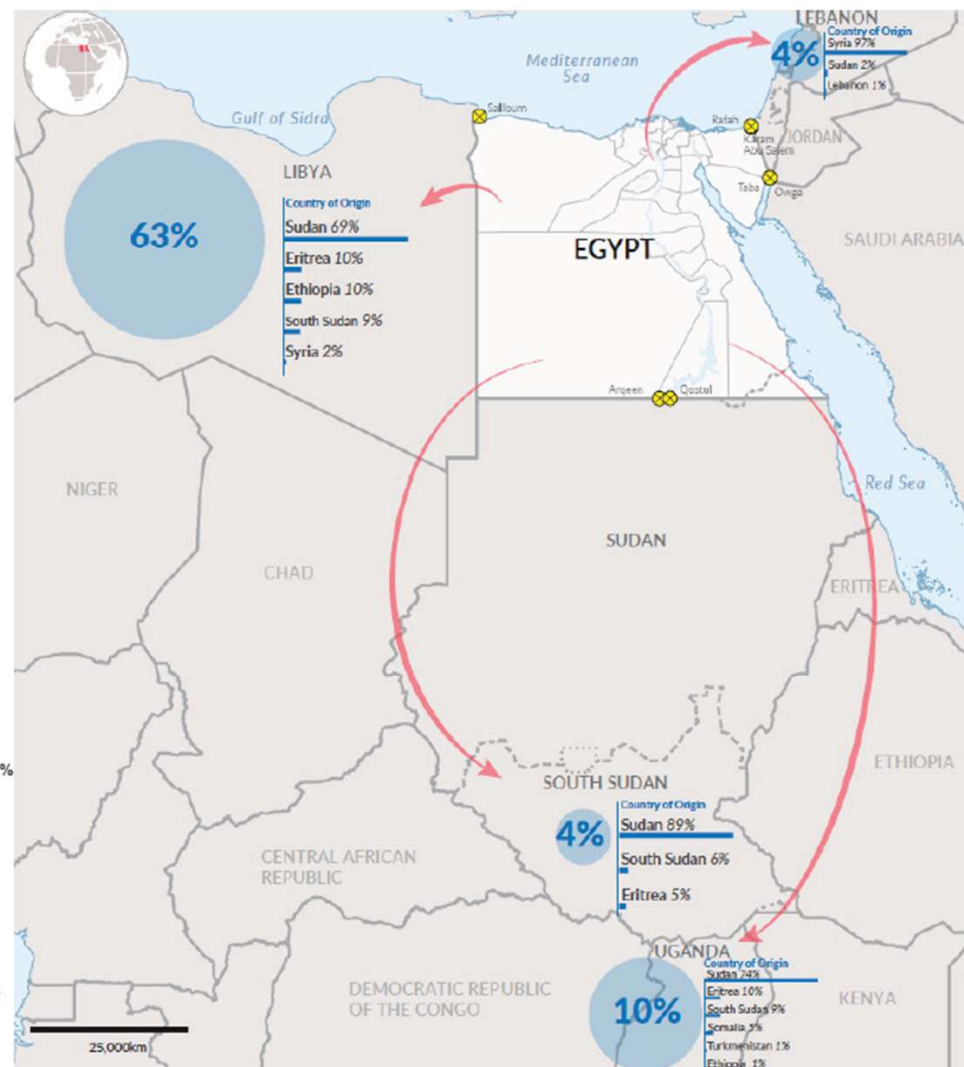
- Sudanese became largest refugee population at the end of October 2023
